1. Four Corners Regional Mobility Hub update

Michael presented the final implementation plan for the regional digital mobility hub. Clyde asked if the State has a timeline for developing the statewide system. Michael replied that they are planning a phase one roll-out early next year. He added that there has been some discussion about including the southwest region and the north front range in phase two, which should be later in 2022.

Clyde asked if there is existing software that would inface one different platforms such as mobile. Michael replied that it is very common to have a process to ensure the web platform translates to a mobile platform. Clyde mentioned that continued Broadband deployment would support this project.
